



Visa and Health Information

The information provided is offered as a general guide only. Entry requirements, health regulations and visa conditions can change at any time. It is the responsibility of each traveller to contact the relevant embassies or consulates of the countries they plan to visit to confirm the most up-to-date entry requirements prior to travel.

Travellers should consult their doctor or a qualified travel health professional before committing to travel arrangements, particularly in relation to vaccination requirements such as Yellow Fever, which may be required for entry into or transit through certain countries.

The Yellow Fever vaccine may not be recommended for certain individuals, including:

- People with severely weakened immune systems
- Those with severe egg allergies
- Individuals with certain thymus disorders
- Adults over 60 years of age, who may require a careful medical assessment before vaccination due to a slightly increased risk of rare complications

Prior to travel, we strongly recommend that travellers consult their physician, a specialist travel doctor or travel health clinic to determine which vaccinations, preventative medications and health precautions may be appropriate based on the countries being visited and their individual health circumstances.

KENYA

Please be advised that Kenya's Electronic Travel Authorisation (ETA) system is now operational. All travellers, including infants and children (except citizens of Kenya and EAC partner states) arriving in Kenya from 4th January 2024, are required to apply for ETA online via <http://www.etakenya.go.ke> prior to their arrival.

Please be advised of the below requirements for ETA applications:

REQUIREMENTS - ALL TRAVELLERS

Valid passport (6 month validity from the date of arrival in Kenya, with a minimum of one blank page)

Passport-style photo

Contact information (home address, email address and phone number)

Itinerary details

Accommodation booking confirmation

Credit card, debit card, Apple pay for payment of \$34 per person

REQUIREMENTS - DEPENDANT ON COUNTRY OF RESIDENCE / TRAVEL HISTORY

Yellow Fever certificate (if arriving from a Yellow Fever endemic country)

Additional vaccinations

Travellers are eligible to apply for ETAs within 3 months of their arrival date in Kenya. Following application, a confirmation will be sent to the email address submitted in the application. Upon approval, the ETA will be sent to the same email address.

Standard processing time for ETAs is three working days and the status of applications can be checked at any time on the ETA website using the ETA reference number.

All previous visa entry requirements for Kenya are now replaced by the requirement of ETAs. All e-visas currently in process will be issued and travellers with existing e-visas will be granted access to Kenya within the validity period of 90 days, without the additional requirement of an ETA.

The eTA website has comprehensive information on what is needed to apply and all other details. Processing time is "generally 3 business days". All travellers should ensure they apply earlier to ensure receipt of the eTA for their travel to Kenya.

Your itinerary to your travellers will meet the needs for "hotel confirmations". They will not need the actual vouchers.

Travellers who have an East Africa Visa obtained from Uganda or Rwanda may use this visa to enter Kenya. Please remember that the visa becomes invalid if the travellers enter Tanzania which did not sign on to the agreement.

Single entry visa does allow one re-entry into Kenya from Tanzania and Uganda

TANZANIA

Applying for a Tanzania eVisa is a straightforward online process completed through the official Tanzania Immigration website. Travellers must complete an online application form, upload supporting documents, and pay the visa fee electronically. Once approved, the visa is issued electronically and should be printed and presented upon arrival in Tanzania.

Key Requirements for a Tanzania eVisa [Tanzania eVisa - Guidelines](#)

To apply for a tourist eVisa, applicants typically need to provide the following ([Tanzania eVisa - Start](#)):

1. Valid Passport

A passport valid for at least six months from the date of entry into Tanzania, with at least one blank page for immigration stamps.

2. Completed Online Application Form

Applicants must fill out the official online visa application, providing personal information, passport details, travel dates and purpose of visit.

3. Passport-Sized Photograph

A recent digital passport photo uploaded during the application process.

4. Travel Itinerary

Evidence of onward or return travel, such as a return airline ticket or flight itinerary.

5. Accommodation Details

Proof of accommodation arrangements in Tanzania, such as hotel reservations or details of the tour operator hosting the traveller.

6. Payment of Visa Fee

The visa fee must be paid online by credit or debit card during the application process.

7. Additional Supporting Documents (if required)

Depending on the purpose of travel, further documentation may be requested, such as invitation letters for business or conference travel.

Additional Entry Considerations

Travellers may also be required to present a Yellow Fever vaccination certificate if arriving from, or transiting through, a country where yellow fever is present ie Kenya.

Processing Time

Most eVisa applications are processed in approximately 4–7 working days, although travellers are advised to apply well in advance of their departure date.
